PEDIGREE

• HIS SIRE Latouro, Champion of the 1989 Holsteiner Licensing in Neumunster, is considered to be one of the most prolific sons of Landgraf I. Landgraf I proved his ability to pass on show jumping talents to his offspring, and produced more than 130 stallions. He was the only sire to have had four sons competing in the World Championships at the same time. He is the sire of Freestyle (Lalique) who won the Grand Prix of Aachen, Libero H who won the Dutch National title five times, and the 1994 Volvo World Cup, Landlord, Linaro and Loutano. Landgraf I's offspring have won just under \$7 million. Ladykiller, Lavita's great, great grandsire on his sire's side is considered to be the most important jumper sire of modern times. Lavita's other great, great grandsire Ronald was for five years the most popular stallion in Holstein, where he sired five licensed sons (among them Rocadero) before moving to Holland and siring Saluut—father of the Australian stallion Salute, and the US show jumper Saluut II. Ronald was sired by Ramiro Z, an exceptional sire, as well as a winner at all levels of showjumping—Nations Cups, Puissance and international grand prix competition. Ramiro Z produced Almiro, Armstrong, Bernstein, to name a few. His daughter Ratina Z won both the gold and silver at the Barcelona Olympics and when Ludger Beerbaum rode her, she won the

Volvo World Cup in 1993. Lavita's dam, Serde, was sired by Capitol I, whose offspring have earned well over 2.5 million Euro at competitions throughout Europe, America and Australia.

PERFORMANCE

• LAVITA COMPETED successfully in the Grand Prix ranks for many years. In 2000 he won the Showpark Western Classic Grand Prix at Thunderbird. In 2001, he won the Menlo Charity Grand Prix, was 3rd in the Kern County Classic, 4th in the Memorial Day Classic, 3rd Portola Valley Classic, 2nd at the Pebble Beach Classic 1, and 3rd at the Pebble Beach Classic 2. In 2002, he won the Oaks International Grand Prix.

PROGENY

• LAVITA'S PROGENY are a diverse bunch. His 2002 Premium yearling Linksman has embarked on a career in combined driving. 2000 mare Philona is competing in eventing. Olieta, 1999 mare is performing in dressage and the 1998 mare Nivita has shown successfully in the jumper arena in South America and is coming to the US. His 2004 colt, Lalair, was Reserve Champion in the 2006 IJF Western Regional—Most Grand Prix Potential category. Lavita crosses well with all types of mares and as his offspring show, he can produce young horses suitable for any discipline.
